Risk Assessment and Health Declaration

Excavation work on this upland site is both physically and mentally demanding. The site and the area around it are covered by environmental protection schemes, so vehicle movements have to be kept to a minimum. Access to the site requires a 15 minute (on average) walk up a steep hillside; the site itself is uneven and stony, and the ground becomes slippery in wet weather.

After

the heavy work of deturfing, excavation involves kneeling for long periods using trowels to investigate the collapsed stone structures; picks and shovels are occasionally used for heavier work. Soil and stones are removed by bucket and wheelbarrow. No mechanical equipment is used on site, and the excavation will not exceed two metres in depth.
